

From the Pastor—*A Christmas Carol* and Generosity

About this time last year, I decided to read through Charles Dickens's *A Christmas Carol*, the classic story about the redemption of the unrelenting miser Ebenezer Scrooge. I had seen it on stage and, thanks to the Muppets, in other forms of high class production, but I had never read the original. It's a good read, a witty and poignant call to seasonal generosity rooted in generic and vaguely Christian assumptions.

This year, I came across the odd phenomenon of people on social media attempting to connect *A Christmas Carol* with contemporary tax legislation. In the cynical manner of social media, one Twitter user cited the novel as evidence that the rich have always needed to be frightened by the supernatural into sharing! This came in response to skepticism that **Congress's generous tax cuts for businesses and the upper ends of the tax bracket will end up providing any benefit to the less fortunate.**

Now, I know far too little of economics to have any sort of informed opinion about all of this, but I do know a bit about human nature. In this, the distillation of the message of *A Christmas Carol* from Twitter isn't far from the truth. **Fallen human nature is more likely to resemble Mr. Scrooge than Mr. Fezziwig. It is far too easy, at least in my case, for frugality and "wisdom" to turn into miserliness and an ungenerous spirit.**

What is lacking in *A Christmas Carol*, is a motive for generosity that goes beyond fear or warm fuzzies (i.e., "the Christmas spirit"). The gospel, truly understood, grounds authentic generosity in the self-giving of Christ: "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). **When we understand the depths of Jesus' condescension to raise us from the poverty of our fallenness, we become increasingly willing to dispose of our resources for the benefit of others.**

I pray that tax cuts and larger paychecks will end up helping the poor and needy. But true generosity begins not with an act of Congress but with an act of God. Hearts transformed by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ will make a bigger difference in the long run. May the love of God in us open our hearts to the needs around us (1 John 3:17), to seek the good of others (1 Corinthians 10:24; Philippians 2:4; Hebrews 13:16), and to be rich in good works (1 Timothy 6:18).

Update on Mission to Dubai—Todd Myra

December 15, 2017

THANK YOU for making it possible for me to go on my mission trip to Dubai! I could not have done it without you!

We had over 300 leaders from 41 different countries and 6 continents in attendance! That is an unbelievably diverse group!

The goal of the conference was to form relationships and partnerships between mission organizations all across the globe as they shared resources, best practices, obstacles, and joined together for prayer and worship.

It was so much more than a conference! Of course they had their main speakers, but then afterwards they had round table discussions. They put a list of several questions up on the screen that the group worked through. A table leader then uploaded all the answers to the **group's website.** **The answers will be used to better the organization and learn how to be more effective in missions.**

One interesting thing I learned is that China and Brazil will be a major force in the future of missions! There are an estimated 100 million Christians in China. Also, they are on track to have the highest GNP on the planet. Brazil has 50 million Evangelical Christians. They are currently third in most missionaries sent. (USA, Korea being first and second). Knowing these statistics is incredibly helpful for being strategic in missions.

One of the highlights of the trip was a worship service in the desert under the stars. We heard from a prominent African speaker, sang many songs and had communion. What a powerful experience to share with such a diverse group in such an amazing location!

I so much enjoyed meeting people from all over the world! I now have several new friends from all over the world— Anne from Kenya, Rafik from Egypt, Elias from Brazil, Sanrita from Columbia, and Naeem from Pakistan. Naeem is a pastor who has been in jail 5 times and they burned his church down. Please pray for him and others in countries that are hostile to the gospel.

There were about 75 people who wore red lanyards that signified that they were from countries that were hostile to the gospel. I could not photograph these people because it could not be known that they were at a missions conference.

Please continue to pray for these people that are reaching out to the global church to ignite mission movements to the unreached!

I am so encouraged knowing that my pictures will bless this ministry and will be used on their website, for promotional pieces as well as for blogs and presentations. This will help spread the word and grow excitement for the next conference in Brazil in 2019!
